Roger B. Hoyt

General Manager, Philmont Scout Ranch



Roger B. Hoyt started his career with the Boy Scouts as a District Executive in Kansas City, Missouri in 1995, and received several promotions including Senior District Executive, Program Director, Senior Program Director and District Director. In 2006, Roger was promoted to the Greater Cleveland Council, in Cleveland, Ohio as the Chief Financial Officer/Director of Support Services. In 2010, he was selected to be the Scout Executive for the Baden-Powell Council in Binghamton, New York, where they achieved Gold Journey to Excellence status in three of four years. Roger served as the Scout Executive of the Northern Lights Council in Fargo, ND from February of 2015 until January of 2019. The council was recognized as a Gold JTE achiever three out of four years, had a \$3.2 million operating budget with six figure surpluses and growing assets of \$17.2 million.

Roger has raised capital support and given leadership to construction of \$15 million in projects, including council service centers, dining halls, swimming pools, conservation and nature lodges, tornado shelters, climbing walls and council campfire amphitheaters. He has approved

over 1,000 Eagle Scout applications.

On January 16, 2019 Roger became the fifth General Manager of Philmont in the last 25 years, and the 14th overall. His primary responsibilities include leadership of 87 full time, 1,214 seasonal and 197 volunteer staff, while managing an operating budget of \$27 million, capital assets of \$64 million, and endowment support of over \$75 million.

In addition, he is leading the strategic direction for Philmont's recovery from the Ute Park Fire of 2018, both in back country and year-round program and camping operations, and in the fire mitigation and restoration efforts.

In his spare time, Roger enjoys hiking in the high elevations, spending time with his incredibly talented, supportive and beautiful wife Diana, and their dog Beau, and doing just about anything in the outdoors, including hunting, fishing and biking.

John C. Keegan

Western Region VP for National Adventures and Program



Judge, mayor, state representative, commander John Charles Keegan is a retired judge of the Justice Court in Maricopa County, Arizona. During a unique career he has held elected office in all three branches of Arizona state government.

Judge Keegan attended West Point, graduated from Arizona State University and attended post-graduate programs at Harvard University and the Naval War College. He was on active duty in both the US Army and the US Navy. He retired with the rank of Commander, USN. In his last several assignments, he was a special agent with the Naval Criminal Investigation Service (NCIS).

In addition to political and military careers, he is a consulting engineer and small business owner, and is the former president of the Arizona Society of Professional Engineers. He is the former mayor of Peoria, Arizona (1997 -2007), and served two terms as an Arizona state representative.

In Scouting, he has been active with the Grand Canyon Council (Silver Beaver 2005) and Western Region (Silver Antelope 2013). He was instrumental in establishing the first Boy Scout troop inside a juvenile correctional facility in the United States. Judge Keegan received the Outstanding Eagle Scout Award in 2013 and the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award in 2016 and is one of only 16 Eagle Scouts to receive both.

John Keegan is married to Lisa Graham Keegan, and they have five children, three grandchildren. One son and one grandson are Eagle Scouts.

Dr. Glenn T. Ault, an Eagle Scout and lifetime member of the National Eagle Scout Association, has served as assistant Scoutmaster, council executive board and executive committee member, Council President and Chairman of the Board of the Greater Los Angeles Area Council, Boy Scouts of America. He is the previous Area 4 President and currently serves as the President of the Western Region. Dr. Ault is a longtime member of the National Order of the Arrow Committee and serves as vice chair of financial resources. He is also active as a regional Order of the Arrow committee member, and was chief medical officer for the 2013

National Scout Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve. He was also the 2017 National Scout Jamboree Administration Chairman. He is the 2021 National Jamboree Chairman and currently chairs the Jamboree task force on rescheduling of the 2021 NSJ which was impacted by COVID-19.

Dr. Glenn Ault proudly remembers leading a fantastic team of committed volunteers as the chief medical officer for the 2013 National Scout Jamboree, the inaugural jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in the wilds of West Virginia. He has served as medical director for the Los Angeles Marathon and as chairman of the USC advisory committee to the 2015 World Games of the Special Olympics.

Dr. Ault's Scouting recognitions include the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope, and Silver Buffalo (2015) awards, William T Hornaday Award, Order of the Arrow Founder's Award, and OA Distinguished Service Award. He is a Vigil Honor member of the Order of the Arrow. A diplomate of the American Board of Surgery and the American Board of Colon and Rectal Surgery, Dr. Ault is a professor of surgery and the senior associate dean of the Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California. Dr. Ault is currently serving as the President of the American Board of Colon and Rectal Surgery as well.

He has two children, Justin Thomas and Taylor Ashley. He is active in his church and is the past president of the school board of St. Mark's Lutheran School.
